Gombe and Beyond: The Next 50 Years

Jane Goodall, Primatologist

Beloved Primatologist Jane Goodall will deliver the keynote address of the First United Methodist Church's Peacemaking Workshop XXIV in Nebraska Wesleyan University's O'Donnell Auditorium at 7:30 p.m. on March 19, 2011.

Goodall first set foot on the shores of Lake Tanganyika, in what is now Tanzania's Gombe National Park, in 1960. The chimpanzee behavioral research she conducted there has sparked an empowering global environmental conservation mission.

Her lecture, "Gombe and Beyond: The Next 50 Years," will reflect on global changes since 1960 and their environmental impact. Goodall will also discuss the role we must play over the next half-century to ensure a better future for coming generations.

The Jane Goodall lecture is presented by Peacemaking Workshop XXIV, organized by First United Methodist Church and in association with Nebraska Wesleyan University.
